CITY NEWS

BUDGETS

City budgets for the year ending 6/30/16 have been passed and it is our pleasure to announce that the City is in quite sound fiscal shape. By October 2017, the Park loan and City Building loan will be paid off, and except for the possible truck replacement program, the City will become debt-free. Much street work has been done over the past years and this work will continue into the future as we strive to keep our roads in good repair. You will see more progress on the Bromley-Crescent Springs Road improvement joint-venture with the County and OKI providing our residents with a greatly upgraded and much safer mode of transportation.

PUBLIC WORKS

* Public Works has added a new full-time position to help keep up with the Park, street and other City maintenance. We welcome Glenn Miller and his vast experience with these vital city services.

* The pilot program for installation of LED lights along Buttermilk Pike has proved successful, and the City is now looking at extending the use of these energy efficient lights farther along Buttermilk and perhaps into other parts of the City.

* Please think before you blow your grass clipping into the street. This refuse will end up washing into the storm drains and clogging up the grates, potentially causing serious problems.

CHECK YOUR INSURANCE BILLS

There is a line on your bill that states the entity to which your "Kentucky Municipal Tax/Fee" is being paid. If it does not say "Crescent Springs" after the dollar amount, please contact your insurance company and request that they correct it. YOUR money should be paid to the City in which you live for improvements to YOUR community.
